

## Sianni Wynn



This Black History Month, we celebrate **Sianni Wynn, (2008) born** and reared in Camden, NJ. Her athletic story began with her father "bribing" her with chocolate bars to overcome pre-race nerves as a child has evolved to her becoming a trailblazing senior at Pennsauken High School who has officially rewritten the record books of New Jersey track and field, Sianni's journey from an eight-year-old national champion to a global phenom is a testament to the enduring legacy of excellence in the Black athletic community. **On March 8, 2026**, she achieved what was once thought impossible: surpassing the legendary gold-medal record of NJ, Olympic icon Sydney McLaughlin-Levrone.

At the 2026 NJSIAA Indoor Meet of Champions, Sianni delivered an unprecedented performance: She became the first girl in state history to sweep the 55m (6.81s) and 200m (23.19s) titles for four consecutive years. Her two victories raised her career total to **13 Meet of Champions titles**, the most ever achieved by any New Jersey high school athlete, breaking the long-standing record of 11 held by McLaughlin-Levrone and Olivia Baker. Sianni remains **completely undefeated** in every Meet of Champions final she has ever contested, both indoors and outdoors.

A University of Florida commit, Sianni currently holds the all-time New Jersey state records in the **55m (6.73)**, **60m (7.29)**, and **200m (23.17)**. Her story is now one of pure dominance and inspiration for the next generation of runners.
